

Warden Paces East Forsyth 16 Track Victory

Raymond Warden and Bill Alexander combined for 27½ points and led East Forsyth to a 93½-24½ track victory over Greensboro Smith yesterday.

Warden, the meet's top individual with 14½ points, won first place in the 100-yard dash and the broad jump, finished second in the high jump, and was a member of the Eagles' triumphant 880-yard relay team.

Alexander won the high and low hurdles events, and finished second in the 220-yard dash.

Greensboro Smith won only two blue ribbons—in the high jump and the shotput.

The meet was held at the North Forsyth track since East Forsyth's track is not in shape.

East Forsyth Has Good Day in Track 65

East Forsyth had its highest scoring day of the season yesterday, beating Greensboro Smith 93½-24½. The Eagles' only loss this year has been to North Forsyth.

Raymond Warden won the 100-yard dash and the broad jump with his best jump of the season—19 feet, 11¼ inches.

Bill Alexander won the high and low hurdles.

Warden leads the season's scoring for East with 69½ points in five meets. Warden has done a :10.6 in the 100, with most of his running being done on a soft track. He has done 5 feet, 8 inches in the high jump. Raymond is also on the 440 and 880 relay teams.

Linville Performs Well

Doug Linville of the Eagles lost only once in the 100 and is unbeaten in the 220. He has done the 100 in :10.5 and the 220 in :23.8.

The Eagles' 880 relay team has done well, with a time of 1:37.6.

Coach Dan Crowe of East doesn't write the discus record in ink. Bob Randall breaks it every meet. He is up to 131 feet, 4 inches.

Jack Smith has shown up well in the 440 with a time of :54.5. David Beeson has lost only once in the mile and has a time of 4:55.

West Forsyth's Hugh Hampton and Johnny Stewart are leading the way for the Titans.

Hampton is one of the top high jumpers in the county and he has been winning in the 100 and 220.

Hampton has done 5-11 in the high jump this year. Hugh's big problem is finding a place to practice. He doesn't have a pit to work in at West Forsyth.

Stewart has a :15.6 in the high hurdles, a :53.6 in the 440-yard dash and has broad-jumped

19 feet, 8 inches.

Barry Quinn has shown up well for the Titans in the half mile, with a time of 2:06.9.

North Forsyth's ace hurdler, Harvey Bauguess, has been slowed down with a pulled muscle. His best time in the high hurdles has been a :15.6 and his best in the lows has been :20.6.

Richard Lavinder paces North's 880 runners with a 2:10.

Bill Raisner is one of the busiest of the North trackmen. He runs the 100, the 440 and is on both the 880 and mile relay teams.

"His times in these events have been hurt because he's doing so much," said Coach A. C. Larrimore.

Watson DuFour and Orville Jones top the pole vaulters with 10 feet, 6 inches.
