Five 1964 champions will try to defend their titles in the sectional High School track meet at Wake Forest Saturday.

Harvey Bauguess of North Forsyth, winner in the high hurdles, and Hugh Hampton of West Forsyth (Southwest Forsyth last year, winner of the high jump, return.

Mike Thornton of Jamestown Ragsdale will return to defend his title in the 100-yard dash.

Bob Albright of Greensboro Grimsley will be back in the 880 run in 2:05.3. He has an entry time of 2:01.8.

Paul Kindley of High Point

returns in the 440.

Bauguess won the high hurdles last year with a :15.4, and his best time this year is a :15.5. His top challengers will be Stuart Peters of Reynolds and Johnny Stewart of West Forsyth who have both done :15.4 Bauguess beat Peters in the city-county meet with a :15.5.

Hampton jumped 5 feet, 11 inches last year. He has matched that this year. Wayne Wright of Greensboro Smith has done 6 feet, 6 inches which is far better than anything in this area. Ray Warden of East Forsyth and Phil Thompson of Southeast Guilford have done 5 feet, 10 inches.

Kindley won the 440 in :52.8 last year, but he finished second to Eddie Hicklin of Burlington Williams in the Central 4-A meet. Hicklin had a :52.2 Stewart of West Forsyth, Forsyth 3-A champion, has a :52.5. Wally Taylor of Jamestown Ragsdale has a :53.

Mike Thornton of Jamestown Ragsdale won the 100 last year in :10.2.2. Mike Garrison of Burlington has the best entry time. :10 flat. Garrison won the 100 in the Central 4-A with a :10.2. Roger Stevens of East Surry, Jack Roten of Appalachian Boone and Ronnie Perrell of Central Davidson have :10.2.

In the 220, Thornton was second last year when Bill Wellman of Southwest Forsyth won in :22.2 Wellman is a freshman at North Carolina. Thornton has a :22 flat, the best entry time. Garrison has a :22.1.

Six records could fall Saturday in the sectional track meet to be held at Wake Forest.

Records in the 100, 220, 880 and 880 relay have all been bettered in regular-season competition. In the field events, the shot and high jump records all in danger.

A couple of fellows named Mike could change the 100 and 220 marks. In the 100, the record is held by David Brown of Mount Airy. It's: 10.1, set in 1963. Mike Garrison of Burlington Williams has a: 10 and Mike Thornton of Jamestown Ragsdale has a: 9.9. dale has a 19.9. May 7

In the 220, the record is :22.1, held by Steve Middleton of Reynolds, who is now at N. C. State. Middleton set the record in 1963. Thornton has a :22 and Garrison a :22.1 in qualifying

Arthur Jacobsen of Reynolds has the 880 record, which is 2:02.2, set in 1962. Jacobsen is now at Duke. John Cheek of Greensboro Page has a 2:00 and Bob Albright of Greensboro Grimsley has a 2:01.

Reynolds holds the record in the 880 relay with a time of 1:34.2. Greensboro Grimsley has matched this time and Burlington has bettered it with a 1:34.1.

Rodney Stewart of Burlington has the shot record with 46 feet, 10½ inches. Two boys have done better. John Thomas of North Davidson has 50 feet, 8 inches, and Jay Hooper of Burlington has 50 feet, 91/2 inches.

Tom Clark of Greensboro Grimsley has the high jump record with 6 feet, 21/s inches, set in 1960 (the oldest record). Wayne Wright of Greensboro Smith has done 6 feet, 6 inches.

Demons Gain Advantage In Mile

Winston-Salem Reynolds, apparently unaffected by some late hours the night before, nipped favored Burlington Williams by one point and captured the team treply in the Central the team trophy in the Central Sectional Track Meet yesterday.

The Reynolds cindermen many of whom admitted to some early morning dancing at the school's annual Junior-Senior dance Friday night - compiled 24 points and led the pack of 29 schools entered.

Burlington, which downed Reynolds by 2½ points at the Central 4-A Conference meet April 30, was second with 23 points. West Forsyth finished a surprising third with 18 points.

No other teams were close. Defending champion Greensboro Grimsley made one of its poorest showings ever, finishing a distant fourth with 14 points. East Forsyth, which scored an upset in the mile relay, scored 11 points and took fifth place.

400 Participate

More than 400 high school trackmen participated in the meet which was held in sunny, 80-degree weather at Wake Forest College.

The excellent weather and track conditions played a role in the establishment of four records. Randy Phillips, Reynolds' stamina - packed miler, got the record breaking under

The mile was the event that put Reynolds on the road to victory. Ron Clitherow finished second behind teammate Phillips. giving the Demons eight points in the event.

Reynolds captured only one other first place. Stuart Peters ran the 120-yard high hurdles in 15.5 seconds and won a blue ribbon.

30 of 416 Qualify

Thirty of the 416 boys (not including members of the top two 880-vard and mile relay teams) qualified to go to the state meet in Raleigh May 21. They include the first three finishers qualify.

Members of the Burlington and Grimsley 880 relay teams. and at the East Forsyth and North Forsyth mile relay teams, also qualified.

Johnny Stewart of West Forsyth qualified in three events. more than any other entry. Stewart finished second in the 440-yard dash, third in the high hurdles, and third in the broad jump. He scored a total of seven points, a big factor in West Forsyth's unexpected thir dplace finish.

Four boys qualified to be in two events at the state meet. They include Jack Roten, Appalachian Boone, 100 and 200yard dashes; Billy Taylor, Mount Airy, broad and high jumps; Terry Duggins, West Forsyth, high and low hurdles, and Peters of Reynolds, high and low hurdles.
