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Track Champ Experiences Poor Luck 1/

Harvey Bauguess of North Forsyth lost his high hurdles sectional championship Saturday without getting the chance to defend it.

Bauguess pulled a muscle in a workout Thursday. He limped to the sectional track meet Saturday, but in trying to warm up for the morning trials he found that he could hardly get over the hurdles, much less race.

So, North Forsyth Coach A. C. Larrimore scratched him. A disappointed Bauguess had to sit back and watch his title go. Harvey had also hoped for a crack at the low hurdles title, an event he has done well in this year. But the pulled muscle ended that, too.

Decathlon Remains

All Harvey has left is a crack at the decathlon which will be held May 25-26, but the hurdles are only one of 10 events in the decathlon.

Bauguess will go to Furman next fall where he'll play football and run with the track team.

Football was a part of his troubles in track this spring. Harvey put on some extra weight to help him in his end position with the Vikings. The pounds made him a better football player but hurt his hurdling time.
