

Grimsley Captures

4-A Cross Country

Greensboro Grimsley, with five runners in the top 10 places, captured the Central 4-A Conference cross country cham-

pionship Thursday at Greensboro Page's field.

The individual winner of the meet, however, was a Winston-Salem Reynolds star, George Phillips who turned in a time of 10:48, a record for the Page field.

Grimsley's top finisher was Joe Browder, who finished second. Other Whirlies in the top 10 were Joe Kelleher, sixth; Skip Anderson seventh; David Buie, ninth; and Bob Deaton, 10th.

Greensboro Smith was second in the team running with 62 points. Grimsley had 34 points. Third was Reynolds with 72.

Grimsley's victory ended a three-year streak by Page, which finished fourth.

A total of 103 runners from 10 schools participated.

Phillips, Garvey Win Cross-Country Title

Winston-Salem could have two top contenders in the state cross-country meet to be held in Chapel Hill the first week in November.

George Phillips of Reynolds won the Central 4-A Conference individual championship while Fred Garvey of Mount Tabor captured the individual title in the District 5, 3-A Conference meet.

Both meets were held Thursday.

The boys must qualify for the state meet through the sectional competition that will be held next week.

Howard Pardue, the Mount Tabor cross-country coach,

was "tripping out" with exhilaration yesterday morning following his team's sparkling performance.

Mount Tabor won the District 5, 3-A Conference championship at Eden, defeating Morehead and High Point Andrews. Mount Tabor scored 19 points, Morehead 53 and Andrews 67.

Pardue was excited for several reasons.

First was the fact that Mount Tabor scored 19 points. A score of 15 is perfect. Mount Tabor had seven of the top 10 finishers.

Second, he was happy with the development of the cross-country program at Mount Tabor. Despite the fact that the school, in its fourth year

of existence, is small when compared to most other Winston-Salem schools, 45 boys are out for cross-country, usually considered a minor sport.

"We've had a tremendous turnout," said Pardue.

Third, and most important, Pardue was pleased with the performance of Garvey and Steve Walker.

Garvey turned in a time of 11:28 over the 2.2-mile course. It is the second straight year that he won the event.

Pardue says that Garvey, a senior, is being sought by Appalachian.

Walker came in second with a time of 11:42.

"Walker's been doing an

outstanding job," said Pardue. "He's even beaten Garvey in several meets."

Mount Tabor's overall conference record is 4-0. It goes to the sectional meet at Myers Park next week.

Phillips, a senior at Reynolds, has worked for his crown for three years.

He took fourth place as a sophomore and 14th last season. That mark, however, is deceiving. Phillips, as a junior, went to the Olympics in Mexico City and fell behind in his training.

He then entered the loop meet with little preparation and finished 14th.

Phillips, who trains the year

round, and Steve Grathwohl of Charlotte Independence will be top contenders in the state event.

Reynolds placed third in the conference meet. It posted a score of 72. Greensboro Grimsley won the event with a score of 34. Greensboro Smith was second at 62.
