

Cross-Country Meet Is Slated Saturday

Oct. 16, 1969

Wake Forest will be host to 15 high school cross-country teams from three states in its invitational meet to be held at the university cross-country course Saturday.

A two-mile race for "joggers" will be held at 10 a.m. This event is open to runners who are over 26 years old.

"We want to bring in the men who jog for fun, rather than the runners who are just out of college," said Coach Harold Rhea of Wake Forest.

The junior varsity high school teams will run at 10:30 a.m., and the varsity will follow at 11 a.m.

Greensboro Page won the team championship last year but has not entered.

Steve Grathwohl of Charlotte Independence was the individual winner and will return to defend his title.

The high school teams will

run two-and-half miles.

Teams entered include East Forsyth, North Forsyth, West Forsyth, Parkland and Reynolds from Winston-Salem; South Mecklenburg, North Mecklenburg, Myers Park and Independence from Charlotte; Greensboro Grimsley; Eden Morehead; West Carteret, Raleigh Broughton, Hargrave Military Academy and Sumter (S.C.) Edmonds.

In addition, individual runners from Bishopville, S.C.; Hillcrest, S.C., and Hartsville, S.C., will also compete.

Grathwohl Captures Cross-Country Title

Steve Grathwohl of Charlotte Independence edged George Phillips in the last quarter-mile and won individual honors in the Wake Forest Invitational cross-country meet yesterday at Wake Forest.

The two boys ran shoulder-to-shoulder through most of the two-and-three-eighths miles course. But as they came down the football practice field and headed for the track, Grathwohl pulled ahead. He widened his lead around the track. Steve's winning time was 11:44.8. Phillips had a time of 11:49. Grathwohl was defending champion.

Charlotte Myers Park won both the varsity and junior varsity team championships.

There were 76 runners in the

varsity group and 79 in the junior varsity. Ten men ran in the "old-timers" held for the first time this year.

Scott Brent, North Forstyh track coach, possibly lost a chance to finish in the top five and get a trophy. Brent saw Bob Boal of Raleigh making a wrong turn and called to him to get him straight.
