Each race includes 16 teams of up to seven runners each, plus 20 runners competing as individuals. Starting times are 10 a.m. for 3A boys, 10:30 for 3A girls, 11 for 4A boys and 11:30 for 4A girls.

The top Charlotte runner is Harding's Steve Rigsbee, the 4A runner-up last year. Rigsbee, though, has been bothered by an ankle sprain, and lost last week in the regionals to Patrick Phillips of Watauga by 13 seconds. Other contenders for the individual title are Glen Mays of R.J. Reynolds and Vince Howard of Page.

East Mecklenburg's strength is its depth, but illness has weakened the team this week, coach Larry McAfee said. Other Mecklenburg teams competing are the North Mecklenburg boys and girls, and
