A former track star at Parkwood High School in southern Union County, Tillman took the leap 11 days ago — his best jump ever — and now looks confidently toward the Olympic Games in Spain this month. Tillman came close to giving up on his Olympic dream many times. It was Galasher Tillman who helped her son decide to compete this year.

"I was in a flux a few months back. I just couldn't decide whether to start the training again. I had a wife, and a baby on the way, and responsibilities at home and work," Tillman, 27, says.

"I talked to my mother about it and she said, 'John, this may be one of the last
