Providence runner races by competition

East Mecklenburg crosscountry coach Larry McAfee calls Niedzialek (pronounced Need-za-lick)

Mecklenburg County's top runner. "He's had an outstanding career

so far," McAfee says. "And I expect him to have an outstanding senior year."

His time of 16 minutes 13 seconds in the 5,000-meters race is the fastest reported time in Mecklenburg County and is 24 seconds better than his closest competitor, Sun Valley's Ryan Adams.

Ironically, Niedzialek's mother, Sandra, is Sun Valley's principal.

Saturday morning at Charlotte's McAlpine Park, Niedzialek, Adams and the region's other top runners will compete in the Wendy's Invitational, one of the country's top high school meets. It starts at 9 a.m. and admission is free.

McAfee said 1,750 high school runners, from Virginia, South Carolina, North Carolina, Tennessee and New York, will compete. Boys and girls runners will participate in four divisions (open, championship, 3A and individual).

Winning Wendy's is one of Niedzialek's goals, as is capturing a state title and adding to the Panthers' rich tradition with such former stars as Ami Herrman and Bryan Calloway.

Niedzialek, who is tall and has blond hair, also is a weight-lifter. In addition to swimming and computers, he's also into music — "I like Nine-Inch Nails and Pearl Jam and Nirvana," he says.

Why cross-country?

"I'd been swimming for (the Mecklenburg Aquatic Club) year round since the second grade," Niedzialek says, "and I wanted to try something different."

He started running in seventh grade after his father, Donald, suggested he try it. By ninth grade, he was undefeated, running the mile for Carmel Junior High's track team. He made all-conference.

Niedzialek stopped competitive swimming in 10th grade.

And as a sophomore, he made all-conference in cross-country and track (1,600- and 3,200-meters). He ran in the cross-country and track state championships.

As a junior, Niedziałek was again all-conference in cross-country and track. He was second to Garinger's Robert East in the 1,600-meters race at N.C. 4A state championships.

"Running has always been fairly easy for me," Niedzialek says. "Swimming has helped me out as

far as endurance.'

Whatever it is, it seems to be working.
