Boys runners to watch

Juniors Scott Williams and Richard Hill of Charlotte
Country Day look like state title contenders. Charlotte Latin's
David Coyle was all-state last year. Providence Day's Ben
Hovis finished second in the state meet last year and teammate Ryan Nunley was 10th.

Brian Lesesky of Providence is the top returning public school runner based on performances from a year ago. Others to watch are Shane Walts of East Mecklenburg, Chris Mayo of Providence and Mike Mauriello of South Mecklen-

burg.

Girls runners to watch

Latin's top two runners return, Shanna Dickerson and Dana Lawing. Providence's Carol Haskin finished fourth in the state as a freshman, but missed much of last season with anemia. Co-captain Erin White returns for Providence and she was all-conference last year. Myers Park's Courtney Horn is one to watch, as are East Mecklenburg's Michelle Ruble, Shana Jung and Mary Van Hellemont, and South Mecklenburg's Rebecca Daughtridge. Also watch North Mecklenburg's Natalie Hollar and West Mecklenburg's Kim Robinson and Stephanie Alexander.

Who could be better?

West Charlotte's girls, with co-captain **Taryn Busch**, return eight of 10 runners. Many of them ran 3 miles for the first time last August. And Providence's boys team is being called a state championship favorite in preseason. Providence's girls get better with Texas transfer **Christine Zemak** and New Jersey transfer **Jen Derosa**.

Hot coach

In six years with Providence, coach Kurt Niedenzu has won four conference titles, two regionals and two state championships. His teams have twice been regional runner-ups and have finished third in the state once.

Are girls stronger this year?

"In any year," says Larry McAfee of East Mecklenburg, "top guys runners tend to be seniors." In last year's regionals, five of the top 12 boys runners were underclassmen—but eight of the top 12 girls were underclassmen.

Notes

Olympic didn't field a girls team last year. Newcomer Adrian Smith will try to get the Trojans going. Girls coach Bennett King will also coach the boys.
