Last Saturday, Walts ran a time of 16 minutes 41.9 seconds and finished first in the Sun Valley Invitational, which featured Meck-

lenburg County's top teams. Providence's Brian Lesesky was second, nearly 12 seconds slower. In cross-country terms, that is equivalent to a 20-point blowout

win in football or basketball.

Last year, Walts was his team's top runner, McAfee said, but didn't do well at the cross-country regionals. So he didn't qualify for the state championships as a sophomore, which, McAfee said, "is hard to do.'

Walts worked hard to improve during track season, reducing his 1,600-meter time to 4:33. "That was 27 seconds better than what he did in junior high," McAfee

Last summer, Walts continued working hard.

He ran 45 miles each week, did speed work and ran with a city track club team. He likes to draw abstracts in his spare time, and friends have asked for some of his work. In the winter, he plans to dive for East Mecklenburg's swim team. For now, however, he's concentrating on the running, on continuing to improve.

"I feel strong now," he said. "I'm not afraid to not go for someone who I know did well in the state last year. This is this year and I've already beaten people I didn't last year."
