Providence's boys, girls sweep gunday, Oct. 1, 1995

INDIAN TRAIL — Providence's boys and girls took the championship divisions of the Sun Valley Invitational cross-country meet Saturday as East Mecklenburg's Shane Walts and Sun Valley's Erin Howard took individual crowns.

There were eight of the 11 Charlotte schools represented at this meet, which became a sneak preview of what coaches might see at Saturday's Wendy's Invitational

at McAlpine. Walts, coming off his strong performance at the 4A regional track meet when he recorded his best time of four minutes 33.7 seconds in the 1600 meters, continued his steady performance by outdistancing Providence's Brian Lesesky by 12 seconds, 16:41.9 to

16:53.4. "I went to the line with my mind open," Walts said. "And I said to myself, 'What do I want to do today,' and I said, 'I wanted to lead my own race and I wanted to win."

He led from start to finish. Walts has finished sixth at UNC Wilmington and fourth at the Wake Forest Invitational this year, posting times of 16:07 and 16:56.

This year, though Providence's boys and girls lost three to four of its top seven runners, they appear strong again. But are they surprised?
