#### Bet you didn't know . . .

At least three track coaches in Charlotte-Mecklenburg are former college all-Americans. They are Myers Park assistant Nicole Hudson at North Carolina, North Meck head coach Rick Jackson at Pembroke State, and South Meck head coach Evans Lalas at Saginaw Valley State University.

■ Four coaches are coaching at their alma maters: Jackson at North Meck, John Eaves at Independence, Bennett King at Olympic and girls coach Brian Lawing at West Mecklenburg.

■ East Gaston's Eddie Wyatt volunteered to coach the Warriors 12 years ago, and he hasn't left since.

■ Charlotte Latin's coach C.W. Stacks pulls double duty during the fall, as the girls' tennis coach and the boys' and girls' cross-country coach. Triple duty actually.

■ Bob Heise, in his fourth season as West Charlotte's boys' and girls' coach, spent one year coaching in Stuttgart, West Germany in 1982.
