Wyatt Smashes Another Record

Winter Park, Florida, May 30—At the Golden South Invitational, the now familiar Wyatt foursome of Milton Wesley, Monte Clopton, Michael Franklin and DeMario Wesley sprinted 1:23.31 in the 4 x 200, an amazing second and a half under the previous national record—1:24.79 by Long Beach Poly earlier this year.

Fresh from their record-smashing 39.76 at the Texas state meet, the foursome from Fort Worth first clocked a No. 2 all-time 39.82 in the 4×100 , as Anderson (Lauderdale Lakes) in 2nd equaled the season-beginning national record of 40.09.

Forty-five minutes later—averaging 20.83 per leg—Wyatt exploded to the record and a 2.6-second victory over Anderson.

On the women's side, frosh Erica Whipple (Suncoast, Riviera Beach) doubled in the sprints (11.90/23.95 into headwinds), and Sherrianne Lawson (Palm Beach Lakes, West Palm Beach) dominated the hurdles in 13.86.

Palm Beach Lakes also won two fast relays (46.30/3:47.52).

Cal State Men: Poly's Sprinters

Norwalk, California, June 5–6—A group of juniors from Long Beach Poly took the California State men's title, primarily by winning all the sprint races.

Poly opened the meet with a 40.45 relay win over Serra for the 9th-best non-Texas performance ever. Then Darrell Rideaux (10.43) and Kareem Kelly (20.76) won the 100 and 200, the latter taking 0.01 off the meet record set by Henry Thomas in '85.

The most competitive event was the triple jump, as Benson Jones (Clayton Valley, Concord) saw his windy first-round 51-11/2 stand up to a 51-0 and four other 50-footers by Jerriod Mack (St. Marys, Berkeley), plus a 50-1/2 by Duran Archie (Hoover, Fresno).

Cal State Women: 4x4 Record

Norwalk, June 5–6—Long Beach Wilson's women waited until the last race of their inter-

scholastic season to produce what many had been expecting all year: a new national 4 x 400 record. And all return next year (see p. 52).

Latrice Borders led off for the Bruins in 54.9. Lashinda Demus followed with 53.1 before Joni Smith's 53.0. Kim Gildersleeve, the 2nd-place finisher in the 800, closed in 55.3 for a final time of 3:36.32.

The mark broke the previous record of 3:37.38 set by a Wilson team two years ago.

Senior Angela Williams won the 100, 200 and long jump, with 11.10w (after a nation-leading 11.31), 23.02 and $19-7^{3/4}$ w. The 200 PR advanced her to No. 7 all-time.

Natasha Neal (Logan, Union City) won the 300 hurdles in 40.86, which made her No. 4 all-time, after a 13.57 short barriers win.



GWI Men: Yeldell's Big Triple

Sacramento, California, June 13—Amid high-70s, near-windless weather conditions at the 39th Golden West Invitational, Greg Yeldell (North Rowan, Spencer, North Carolina) produced a 53-3^{1/4} triple jump. It was the No. 8 wind-legal jump in prep history and moved him to No. 6 on the all-time performer list.

Yeldell opened with two jumps over 51-feet (51-7^{1/4}, 51-10^{1/4}) and exploded the biggie after Quiande Moore (Zion-Benton, Zion, Illinois) challenged with a second-round 51-7.

Buoyed by his PR, Moore went on to win the

high jump with a PR 7-2 and take a long jump 4th (23-5).

The 800 brought together national leader Jason Van Swol and last year's fastest, Moses Washington, but the win went to Cal State champ Jon Stevens. Uncharacteristically, Washington led early, through quick 52.8 and 1:19.9 splits. Tiring in the final 150, he was passed by Van Swol and Stevens, who had charged from well off the pace and kept going to a 1:48.65.

Van Swol, too, dipped under 1:49, while Washington improved his season best to 1:50.03 in 3rd.

Texan Jimmy Autenreith dominated a strong vault field to win at 17-0 while three other Texans topped 16-6. Autenreith missed badly at 17-6 and on his third effort landed in the vault box, bruising his back.


